



FROM LEONARDO TO THE BAUHAUS: THE RISE OF THE ARTIST-SCIENTIST



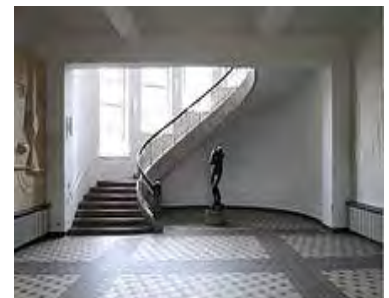
An Illustrated Talk by Richard Whincop

Richard's talk investigates the coming together of Art and Science in the person of Leonardo da Vinci, and his scientific approach to painting in the analysis of light, perspective, anatomy and human expression. It explores how Leonardo's influence inspired later artists such as Vermeer and Joseph Wright of Derby, and culminated in the rational aesthetic of the Bauhaus in the 20th Century.

A self-taught artist, Richard graduated in Art History and English at York University in 1986. He then moved to Glasgow, where he became an established figurative artist with a series of successful solo shows. He now exhibits at galleries and art fairs throughout the UK and Ireland. Since moving to Lavant in 2010 he has painted a commission for St Mary's Church.
