In this talk, Mark describes how Italy chose to go to war in 1915. He analyses the political intrigues and campaigns that followed, up to the disastrous battle of Caporetto in October 1917, which almost knocked Italy out of the war.

Fighting conditions were as bad as on the Western Front. Instead of occupying mud, the Italians faced limestone mountains ...

Mark will also consider the impact and legacy of the war with its political, social and cultural ramifications.
